FiE 2023: Import Promotion Desk presents wide range of extracts

Ginger, black cumin, liquorice root, guayusa, cocoa, vanilla and much more – plant extracts are on focus at the IPD stand: Hall 4.0F202

Bonn/Berlin, 19.10.2023 - The Import Promotion Desk (IPD) presents producers of natural ingredients from developing and emerging countries at Food Ingredients Europe (FiE) in Frankfurt. From 28 to 30 November, importers and buyers will have the opportunity to meet producers of plant extracts, such as CO₂ extracts, powder extracts and essential oils, and to check out the wide product offer. The initiative for import promotion, a project of the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ), accompanies companies from 12 partner countries to the FiE: Egypt, Ethiopia, Ecuador, Ghana, Indonesia, Kenya, Morocco, Peru, Tunisia, Ukraine and Uzbekistan.

CO₂ extracts from ginger, black cumin, mint

"Apotec Bay Botanical Solutions" from Egypt and "Actifs Précieux" from Tunisia, two companies that use CO₂ extraction, will be represented at FiE. "Apotec Bay Botanical Solutions" from Egypt uses the gentle and sustainable process for its natural extracts, which are obtained from coffee, paprika, black pepper, cardamom or cinnamon, for example. The Tunisian company "Actifs Précieux" specializes in extracts based on natural raw materials from the Mediterranean region or Africa. They manufacture products from ginger, black cumin, mint, coriander seeds and fruits, and Aleppo pine seeds, among others.

Liquid extracts from maca, guayusa and cocoa shells

"Nunalabs" from Ecuador specializes in the extraction of pastes and liquid extracts from the South American plant world. The tuber maca is used as a medicinal herb, the holly *Ilex guayusa* is valued for its caffeine content, and cocoa shells are known for their intense aroma.

Extracts from liquorice root as well as cocoa, coffee and vanilla

The Uzbek company "Yuma Bio" is also present at FiE. Among other things, it produces extracts from the liquorice root, which are used in teas and in the medicinal sector, but also for the production of liquorice.

"Sima Arôme" from Indonesia also offers a large portfolio of high-quality extracts, including extracts from coffee, cocoa, cinnamon or vanilla, but also ginger, turmeric and tamarind are processed into extracts.
